

Short notice about Flights and FP's

The original FSX files will presumably be appropriate "as is" under FSX box version.

The enclosed Flight Descriptions and Flight Plans have been updated/modified taking into consideration :

- * assuming that most pilots fly in real weather conditions, or sim weather at their own option, understand that departure and landing runways stated in original set are no more part of the updated flightplans, and only mentioned for information (thus check weather and select appropriate runways),
- * using only simulators stock data, understand without any AIRAC updates to the stock nav aids and airports database,
- * all headings are Magnetic,
- * FSX Steam database,
- * MSFS 2020 database,
- * P3D5 database,
- * P3D6 database,
- * XP12 database (AIRAC 2112).

As you will find into the Flight descriptions, Airports and Nav aids (when not decommissioned) are from time to time located at slightly different LON/LAT coordinates from one simulator to the other. This leads to some different headings, waypoints, or and/nav aids + frequencies here and there from one simulator to the other.

The Flight Plans numbers are into the right folders. Each simulator can be identified by the suffix to the *.pln or other file type flight plan number, for instance :

1774-01-01-**F** refers to **FSX**, as **M** would refer to **MSFS**, **P5** (P6) to **P3D5** (**P3D6**), and **X** to **XP(12)**.

As far as LNM flight plans are concerned, same rule as above, except that one *.lnmpln flightplan can also cover several simulators, for instance : 1774-01-01-**FM**, which would apply to both FSX and MSFS.

When necessary, the Flight Descriptions do mention for each flight the relevant simulator, and concerned headings or information (sim by sim) are printed in different colours (**FSX**, **MSFS**, **P3D5**, **P3D6**, **XP12**), or simply black when data refers to "uncoloured" (=several) simulators.
