After the Break-up of the former USSR Circa 1991, a number of these smaller Countries that sprang up wanted to change over to the Westernised System of Accounting.

DC3 Airways was awarded the Contract to fly a dozen or so "Bean Counters" to some of these Countries where they will conduct Seminars' on Western Style Accounting Procedures.

We collect our Passengers at Istanbul (LTBA), and then fly in a Zig-Zag Easterly direction from Europe's dividing line with Asia Minor using our trusty DC3
